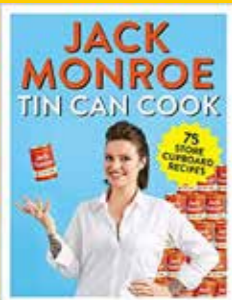

Mass Intentions

Making an offering for a Mass is one of the ways in which the faithful can associate themselves more closely with Christ's offering of himself and in so doing experience its effects more fully.

It is also a practice that helps provide for the Church's needs and especially for the support of priests.

When an offering is made for a Mass then it is usually made for a particular intention of the donor, which is then prayed for, especially by the priest, at a particular Mass.

Mass Intention envelopes are available in the church porch. Completed, they can be placed in the Sunday Offertory collection or handed direct to the priest.

Choosing a particular date

At present, in our parish, Mass intentions for a particular month are usually fully booked some 6-8 weeks before the beginning of that month.

If you wish to have a Mass offered on or near a particular date - for example to mark the anniversary of someone who has died - you are advised to 'book it' three months in advance. (We will book it to on the chosen date if it is available, otherwise it will be allocated to the nearest date or preferred time)

To assist people in choosing a date, current intentions already 'booked' can now be checked on line, on the parish website. Go to www.stnicholasboldmere.co.uk/worship.html and use the pull-down menu following 'Celebrations of Mass'.

NB The on-line listings are updated once a week, usually on Monday. They may not be entirely up-to-date by the end of a week.

First Holy Communion Preparation 2019-20

The draft timetables for next year's First Holy Communion programme are now available in the porch. There are two timetables. One is the whole parish programme - for all families and children; and the other only for children not at St Nicholas School, who will come to the Saturday morning classes.

Application forms for the programme will be available at the parents' meetings on 7 / 9 September.

One difference in the programme this year is (taking the place of the series of parents' meetings with Fr Allen) there will be - for parents - one introductory meeting and then a series of small group meetings, for their own discussion and reflection. These sessions are designed to support parents' own continuing faith formation, and support to one another at this important time for them and their families. There will be more details regarding these meetings in September. *In the meantime it would be very helpful if five or six parents would volunteer to lead these groups. Leading a group might sound daunting - but it really simply means making sure the group starts on time and finishes on time, and stays on task! The resources for each meeting are for the group as a whole to deal with... The big advantage of leading a group is that the leader chooses when and where it meets!*

Meetings can take place most anywhere - in the Benedict and McEvilly rooms, or in a local coffee shop or pub, or in the leader's home - and at a time of the leader's choice. Groups will be for five or six people. Leaders choose the where and when, and others will get the chance to choose from the available groups.

A chance for parents to deepen and develop their faith and still better support their children as they take the next steps toward full participation in the life of the Church.

The Liturgy of the Word

Genesis 18:1-10

Stillness is Golden: Several of the songs today are prayers for stillness, and attentiveness.

This is not just about being quiet! When the Church is gathered, being quiet is not always possible! But an inner, gentle, contemplation of our relationship with God – our work, our fundamental mode of participation in the Liturgy – is something we can engage in, even amidst the (welcome!) noises of our Sunday assembly.

It is the most essential thing we do at Mass: gazing and pondering and resting in the presence of the sacred. The other actions and ‘things’ of the Mass are not incidental to this contemplation – but they are often what others ‘do’. Sometimes we join with them, but more often we pray what they do, to come to new communion with God.

near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. ‘My lord,’ he said ‘I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant’s direction.’ They replied, ‘Do as you say.’

Abraham hastened to the tent to find Sarah.’ ‘Hurry,’ he said ‘knead three bushels of flour and make loaves.’ Then running to the cattle Abraham took a fine and tender calf and gave it to the servant, who hurried to prepare it. Then taking cream, milk and the calf he had prepared, he laid all before them, and they ate while he remained standing near them under the tree.

‘Where is your wife Sarah?’ they asked him. ‘She is in the tent’ he replied. Then his guest said, ‘I shall visit you again next year without fail, and your wife will then have a son.’

The mystery is Christ among you, your hope of glory: this is the Christ we proclaim, this is the wisdom in which we thoroughly train everyone and instruct everyone, to make them all perfect in Christ.
