This is what Christ said, on coming into the
world: 'You who wanted no sacrifice or oblation,
prepared a body for me. You took no pleasure in
holocausts or sacrifices for sin; then I said, just
as I was commanded in the scroll of the book,
"God, here I am! I am coming to obey your will."'

Notice that he says first: You did not want what
the Law lays down as the things to be offered,
that is: the sacrifices, the oblations, the holo-
causts and the sacrifices for sin, and you took no
pleasure in them; and then he says: Here I am! I
am coming to obey your will.

He is abolishing the first sort to replace it with
the second. And this will was for us to be made
holy by the offering of his body made once and
for all by Jesus Christ.

A Christmas Story

Fr Roberto was invited to preach a Retreat for Christmas in a parish in San Paulo in Brazil. In every sermon that he gave he promised the people that for Christmas they would have a great 'living crib'. People were anxious to see it.

The 25th December was approaching but there was nothing new to see. The usual crib was prepared in the usual way, and put in the usual place, by the usual people.

Two days before Christmas Fr Roberto again announced the great event. After the sermon he called three students and told them. 'In these two days before Christmas you are exempt from coming to the retreat. I would like you to go to the poorest areas of the Parish and look for the poorest families. Write down the names of the parents and the number of the children and their exact address. Bring the results of this census to me on Christmas Eve.'

And so they did, bringing back about a hundred addresses. Fr Roberto wrote them out on separate pieces of paper, folded them and placed them on a tray. Then just a few minutes before the Midnight Mass, he slipped into the Church and placed the tray on a small table beside the altar.

When the celebration of Mass started, he went towards the altar carrying two posters. He brought one to the usual crib and left it there. That poster said 'Dead Crib. Then he laid the other beside the tray - and that poster said 'Living Crib'.



There was complete silence in the church. People wondered what the posters meant; they waited for an explanation.

Fr Roberto spoke briefly: 'Social injustice; unemployment; lack of housing; lack of love and respect for the human person and his rights; ignorance and poverty, - all these things - have forced Christ to change his address. We won't find him if we only look in the old places. Today, Christmas Day, he is waiting for you to visit him at his new address - the addresses you will find in this tray.'

After Mass the Church emptied of the people. And so did the tray of its papers.

And the baker was asked to set to work to bake more bread - and he did; and the butcher was asked to bring the meat out of the cold store - and he did; and the shopkeeper was asked to open up to sell rice and beans and milk and sweets and toys and clothes and pens - and she did.

The people had found the Living Crib.
